Modular bathroom units -- all molded in one-piece reinforced polyester plastics -- feature push button height adjustments that bring the fixtures into every child's reach!





just disassemble the wings you no longer need, and return them to the nearest Second Hand Wing Lot.



The True Story...

The House of the Future wasn't really for sale to the public as a "tract home," but it was real, standing at the edge of Main Street, by the entrance to Tomorrowland, for one quick and chaotic decade.

From June 1957 to September 1967, more than 20 million guests filed into the home, through its hallways and across its plastic floors. They were queued up to marvel at the future, but were seeing what was, in many cases, already the present.

Like the Monorail and the PeopleMover, the House of the Future was much more than just an attraction for a theme park: it was a working prototype meant to demonstrate practical applications of Future technology. Utilizing the combined research and talent of many major American corporations, the House of the Future represented, more than anything, the spirit and the vision in which Tomorrowland was conceived. The lessons learned in the House of the Future were no doubt destined to become a part of Walt Disney's greatest dream, the Experimental Prototype Community of Tomorrow.

The House of the Future was conceived in 1953 by the Plastics Division of the Monsanto Chemical Company, in cooperation with the architectural firm of Hamilton and Goody, and the Department of Civil Engineering at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Monsanto, which was already a participant in Tomorrowland with its "Hall of Chemistry," built the House at Disneyland in 1957 with the hope of widening the public and industrial acceptance of the then-blossoming field of plastics. And the project provided ample demonstration of the material's durability -- the cantilevered wings of the House sagged less than a quarter of an inch after a decade of time and millions of footsteps.

The interior of the House was every bit as marvelous as the exterior. In fact, each of the products, features, and claims portrayed in this fictional "sales brochure" represents actual concepts instituted or planned for the House of the Future, as seen in reports, handouts, and magazine articles of the period.

When the original Tomorrowland was demolished in 1966 the House was spared -- but for only a year. By the time the New Tomorrowland opened in 1967, Monsanto had focused its attention on the new "Adventure through Inner Space," and decided to allow their option for the House to lapse. That December, a wrecking crew came in to tear it down.

After two weeks of pounding, torching, drilling, and cutting, the House of the Future finally gave way, and it was carried off in little broken pieces. To this day, though, "park-eologists" can still uncover evidence of its existence: the walkways, reflecting pools, and even the sixteen-foot square column that supported the central utility core, all still stand in their original location just off Main Street. And the original striped patio structure, where Monsanto distributed literature that proclaimed a plastic future, still functions nearby as a Fantasyland souvenir stand.

On this 30th and 20th Anniversary, we bid both Hello and Farewell to the House of the Future.
